Covid-19

The onset of the pandemic has had a devastating effect on all our member organisations. With the majority of the groups being volunteer led almost all programmes have come to a standstill.

Despite the situation some of our resilient and dedicated volunteers under strict guidelines have continued supporting the community as best as possible. We have especially made provisions to support vulnerable people in the community through emergency food packs, and hot cooked meals. So far we have distributed over 20,000 meals to vulnerable people in the community.

We have also noticed a significant spike in issues around mental health and wellbeing with a particular focus on domestic violence cases, depression, heightened anxiety, youth disengagement, and loneliness with our seniors.
